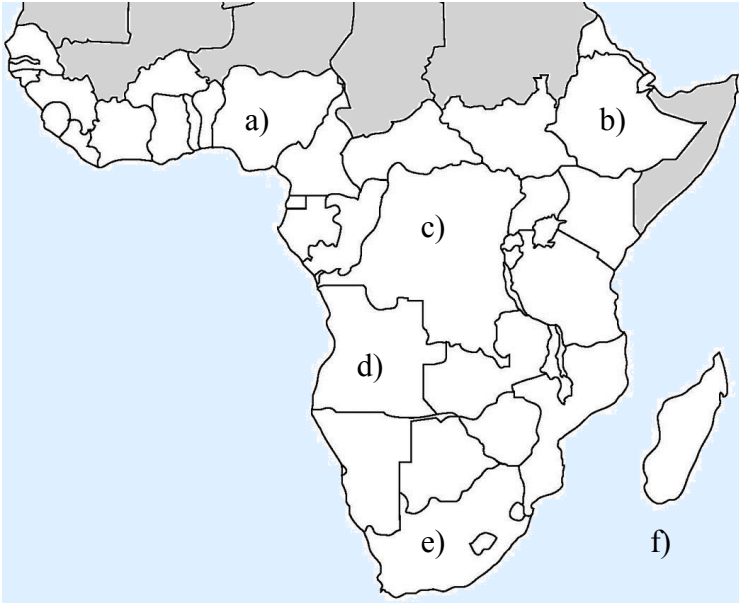


**Part 1: Geography and World History**
