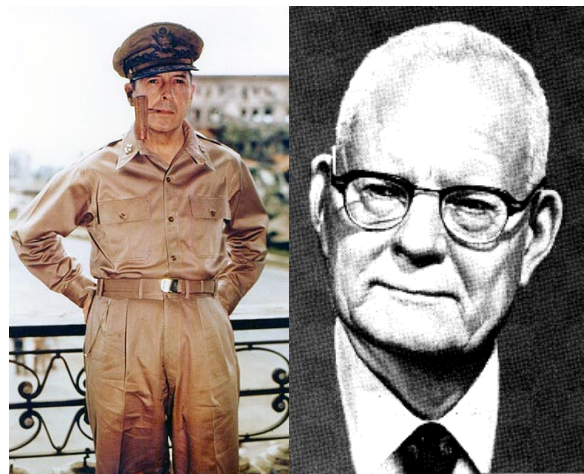


L: Post-Imperialism: A Closer Look at Japan Today

1. Japan became the peaceful country because it was defeated in **World War II in Asia (1937-45)**. Although this fact is *necessary* to explain Japan's benign modern culture, it is not *sufficient*. There is one other main reason.
2. After the United States defeated Japan, it occupied the country from **1945 to 1952**. During this occupation, Americans helped Japan to create a free and wealthy country.
 - a) General Douglas MacArthur was responsible for creating Japan's new constitution (the one that still has the emperor as a symbol, but promises never to wage war again).
 - b) Under his supervision, Japan began to have more political freedom, including democratic elections and the protection of rights.
 - c) In addition, an American business genius named William Deming arrived in Japan to teach its business leaders how to create efficient factories and businesses.
 - d) His teachings were so helpful in boosting Japan's level of technology and wealth that Deming remains a hero to the Japanese to this day. The *Deming Prize* is award annually by the the Japanese society of scientists and engineers as the most prestigious industrial award in Japan to honor the most innovative company of the year.
5. Because Japan has kept its promises since **World War II**, it has earned the right to develop one of the world's strongest military forces again, which operates as a peace-keeping or "self-defense" force, and its security is guaranteed by an alliance with the United States, the world's police power.
