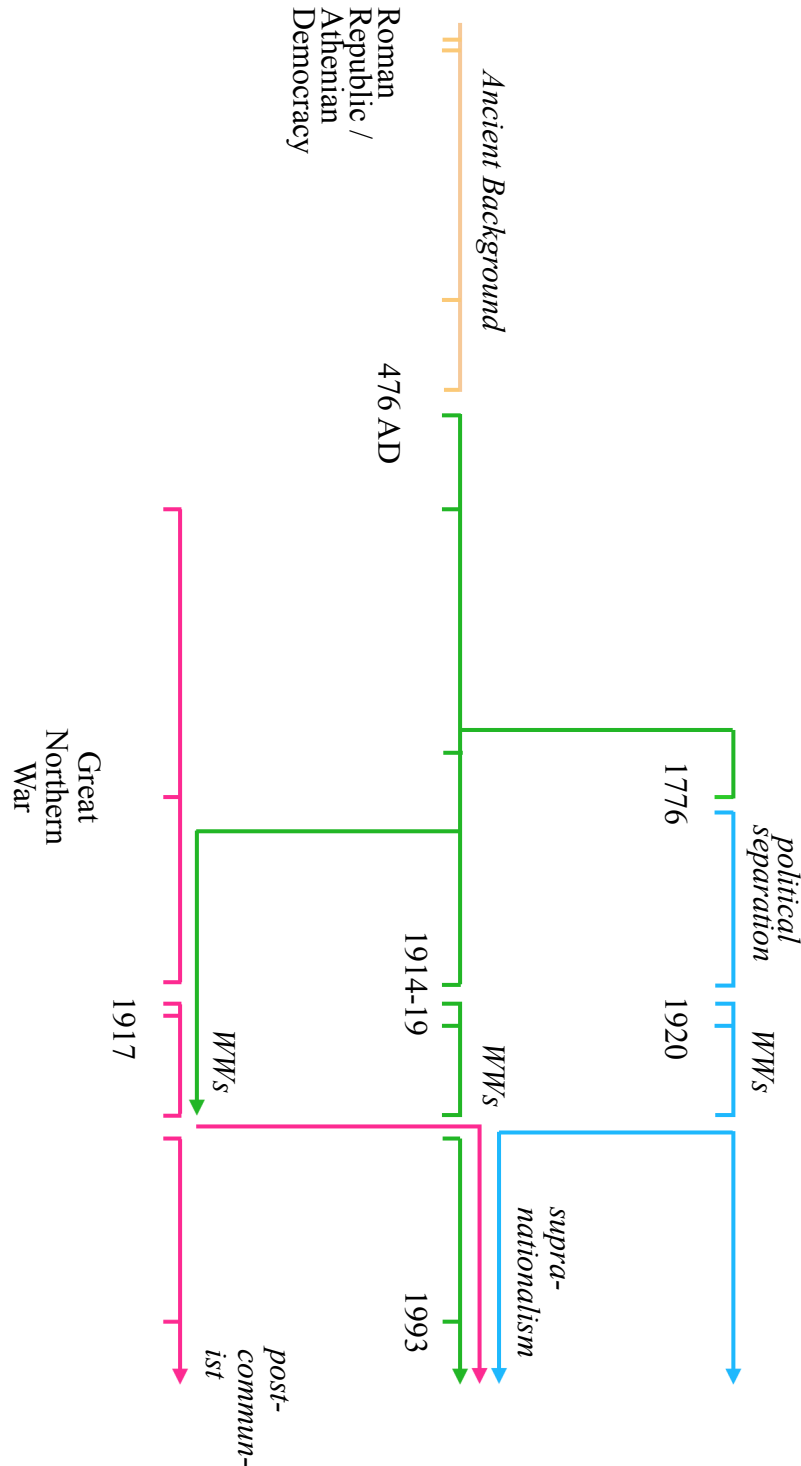


Part 1: Timeline
